Earthquakes are natural disasters that humans cannot control. Sometimes earthquakes can be very dangerous and people need to know more about where earthquakes come from, and how to protect themselves from them and any other natural disasters.

Earthquakes are the shaking, rolling or sudden shock of the earth's surface. They are the earth's natural means of releasing pressure. More than a million earthquakes occur in the world each year. Earthquakes can be felt over large areas although they usually last less than a minute. However, earthquakes cannot be predicted although scientists are still working on the problem.

There are about 20 plates along the surface of the earth that move continuously and slowly past each other. When the plates squeeze or stretch, huge rocks form at their edges and the rocks shift with great force, causing an earthquake. As the plates move,

Shaking and groundbreaking are the main effects created by earthquakes, principally resulting in more or less severe damage to buildings and other structures. The severity of the effect depends on the complex combination of the earthquake magnitude.

Groundbreak is a major risk for large engineering structures such as dams, bridges and nuclear power stations and requires careful mapping of existing faults to identify any likely to break the ground surface within the life of the structure.

A University of Pennsylvania student got a shock when they began doing a late night experiment to test **such a robot**. Shortly after pressing the switch on the smoke machine, a loud fire alarm went off.

The whole building got shaken and the student called Prof Zhao who was very surprised. The incident was a minor setback for the team developing a robot equipped with a innovative radio-based sensing system.

Prof Zhao explained that they have been trying to help robots obtain superhuman vision – to see in scenarios where human eyes or traditional visual sensors cannot. He suggests the technology could help a future search and-rescue robot save people from a burning building.
