The Setting of the Story (Time and Place)

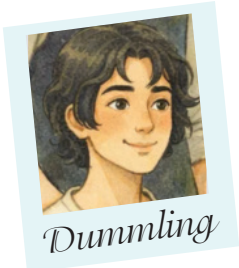
Time: "Once upon a time," in a classic fairy tale past.

Place: It begins in a small home near a forest. The story then moves to a hotel in a busy market town, continues along a road through villages, and ends at the royal palace of a kingdom.

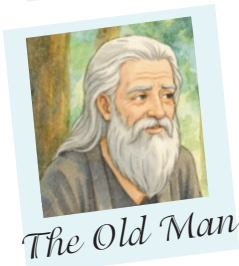

Summary of the Story

- 1 A poor man sends his three sons into the forest to cut wood.
- 2 The two eldest brothers are rude to an old man who asks for food and they fail.
- 3 The youngest brother, Dummling, is kind to the old man and shares his food.
- 4 For his kindness, the old man rewards Dummling with a goose that has golden feathers.
- 5 At a hotel, three greedy boys try to steal a feather and magically get stuck to the goose.
- 6 The next morning, Dummling leaves, and the stuck boys are forced to follow him.
- 7 More people who try to help get pulled away also get stuck, forming a long, funny parade.
- 8 This strange parade passes by the castle window of a princess who has never laughed.
- 9 Seeing the silly line of stuck people, the princess laughs for the very first time.
- 10 The king keeps his promise, and Dummling marries the princess, proving that kindness is the greatest treasure of all.
